I was up at our cottage again for the Thanksgiving weekend close up. Of course there was some time to put up the 20/40 m dipole and use the FT-817. 20 and 40 were hopping on Saturday and Sunday and I made a number of contacts with the 4 Watts on hand. Monday was a bust as a solar flare killed most of the action, but we had to stop the fun and close up for the winter. This, of course, means dumping the hot water tank and all water systems, adding antifreeze to various orifices (sinks and toilet) and dealing with the well's pithead adapter. The adapter (7 feet down from the well head) must be raised about ½ “ very carefully to drain the water in the line from the well head to the house. This is accomplished with a threaded 8-foot pipe with a T handle at the top of the pipe. If you raise the adapter out of its holder, by mistake, you have to fight with the weight of 80 feet of ABS hose and the submersible pump to return it to the holder! Fun! This time everything went as planned. If we had the time and \$ we should have installed an electrically controlled solenoid valve when the pithead was being installed!

Oh yes, further to last month's message, I am the proud owner of a QSL card from the Wood Island (ME) lighthouse. Now I have to print some QSL cards ... ☺

--Henry VA3OV had coax with him tonight to sell at 60 cents a foot.


