Highlights of 2015 and Report to the Annual General Meeting

Repeaters: Charles VE2RFI continues to work upgrading and maintaining the two repeaters. This year Charles installed an input tone (88.5 Hz) on the VHF repeater. The VHF repeater still has some quirks, for example occasional dropouts, which Charles is investigating. The UHF repeater is in top notch shape.

Sunday Evening Net:

Our regular Sunday evening information net has seen a decline in participation this fall, but still functions very well. Current net control operators are Marc-André VE2EVN, Harrison VE2HKW, and myself. The net remains a good blend of socializing and radio discussions and remains friendly to new hams. Our get together for lunch and eyeball QSOs in May was well attended and well enjoyed by all accounts.

Everyone should feel free to join in Sunday evenings, September - June at 8:00 pm local on VE2RWI, 146.91 MHz(-) T88.5, if you're close to a 2m radio.

Newsletter: Bram VE2XCS does an excellent job with the monthly newsletter. The minutes that Keith VE2MTL produces keep us well informed on meeting happenings.

This year Bram added regular columns on scanner frequencies and on smartphone apps. François VE2AAY, provided an excellent article on the design of the VLF transmitting station at Grimeton while Bram, Gilles VA2EW and I provided some photo essays. Meetings: I know we all appreciated Andy, VE2DNN, providing the coffee and refreshments for the monthly meetings. Cookies for the meetings are provided by member volunteers. You can sign up now for a month 2016 – act quickly before they're all snapped up.

New Members: We welcomed new members Mike VE2MXU, André VE2HIL, Tony VA2TCB, Vlad VA2TTA, Peter VA2PBJ, and Marc-André VE2EVN during 2015. Many of them are quite active in club activities.

Field Day

June 2015 saw another excellent field day, the fifth annual multi-club field day, the third in a row at Centennial Park in Beaconsfield. Eamon VE2EGN was the coordinator ably assisted by George VE2NGH, Bob VE2PDT, Dan, VA2KEY and Charles VE2RFI. I won't reproduce Eamon's report (see the September newsletter), but some highlights follow.

The main change was moving from the 1A to the 2A class. The glitches from having two HF stations on the air simultaneously were few and far between and both stations were almost continuously active. It was absolutely a successful transition.

For the second year in a row we used wire antennas on HF and 100% battery. Dan VA2KEY again organized sponsorship that saw Batteries Expert of Ile Perrot loan us the needed battery capacity. Thank-you Dan and thank-you Batteries Expert.

Once again Eamon organized tutorial sessions on HF operating and on using the logging software N1MM prior to field day.

We had another excellent event due to Eamon's hard work organizing and to everyone who pitched in before and during Field Day. Thank-you all.

This Fall Eamon surveyed field day participants for their opinions on various aspects of field day. We should see the results sometime early in the new year. Also early in the new year we will have a meeting to discuss and plan for the 2016 field day event.

Monthly meetings

We continued monthly meetings full of content with a good mix of topics and presenters. The monthly meetings were quite well attended and saw active participation from members of the club.

In January we added a new item to the meeting agenda at the suggestion of Gilles, VE2TZT. *Tip Time* is for members to share handy tips with the rest of us.

At the January meeting Loftur Jonasson, VE2LJX introduced his *Automatic Magnetic Loop Antenna Tuning Controller*.

February saw Gilles, VE2TZT gave us *An Introduction to the Mysteries of Propagation*.

In March John, VE2EQL told us about *High Performance Wire Antennas*.

In April we had a presentation over Skype. From his home QTH in Gatineau, Bert VE2ZAZ gave us an overview of the Ottawa area implementation of a *Broadband Hamnet*. This will probably not be the last remote presentation we see at WIARC.

In May at our regular *Show and Tell* meeting we had excellent presentations from Keith VE2MTL, Charles VE2RFI, Harrison VE2HKW, Bob VE2PDT, Dave VA2DGC, Vlad VA2TTA, Andy VE2DNN, and myself. As usual we used the June meeting for Field Day planning.

The September meeting was taken up with summer activity reports from Eamon, VE2EGN on Field Day; Vlad VA2AN on a visit to his friends contest station, flying in by helicopter; Charles VE2RFI demonstrated his portable vertical antenna to be used for mountain topping; Gilles VA2EW on the Contest Club Ontario barbeque; myself on SOTA activations.

In October, Glenn MacDonell of Radio Amateurs of Canada brought us up-to-date on the state of amateur radio in Canada, the current state of RAC, and his vision of the organization going forward.

At the November meeting Mark VA2MM took us through the iterations of his *Remotely Operated Station*.

Some of the flash talks we saw were: Nigel VA2NM on a Poor Ham's Scalar Network Analyzer in January; In February we had a reports on Winter Field Day operations and on Canada Ski Marathon operation; Bob VE2PDT reported on using WSPR in March and showed us SSTV images he captured from ISS transmissions in April; Gilles VA2EW on his 160m transmitting antenna in June and on stacking a second SteppIR on his tower in September;

Summer Get Togethers: We opened the church on the third Monday of July and August for members to get together if they wished. We had no presentations planned and promised no refreshments. Many members turned up and took advantage of flea market tables, socializing, and an opportunity to show off and discuss projects in progress.

Examiners: Mark VA2MM joined Larry VE2DO as club sponsored examiner. This was prompted by an interest in amateur radio on the part of some of his students. Five have so far attained their basic qualification.

Silent Keys: We lost Peter Cheasley VE2TPR, Thain MacDowell VE2NI, and Joe Cassidy, formerly VE2QG this year.

Other Activities

Chillycon: Dan VA2KEY, Harrison VE2HKW, Bob VE2PDT, Marc-André VE2EVN and Bram VE2XCS participated in the ChillyCon QRP get together at Rideau River Provincial Park in September.

Winter Field Day: Dan VA2KEY, Harrison VE2HKW, Bob VE2PDT, and I were back at Harrison's QTH for the 2015 edition of the annual Winter Field Day. It was a great time for the second year in a row.

Summits on the Air: On November 7 nine WIARC members, friends and family went on an activation of Montagne de Rigaud. Afterwards we followed it up with an afternoon lunch at the Willow Inn in Hudson.

Canada Ski Marathon: The Canada Ski Marathon has been using amateur radio volunteers for communications support for 42 years. For the 2015 running of the marathon François VE2AAY and I volunteered at the event.

Your Executive: Bram VE2XCS started studies at Cégep de Saint-Laurent this fall and received two amateur radio scholarships to support his studies. Congratulations Bram.

Coming up in 2016

State of the Club: Two things that have come up this fall are questions about the state of and the future of the club. For example, is the club's mission statement still appropriate? What is the purpose or purposes of the club? Are we facing trouble with declining membership? 8. **After the Break:**

This month, we were thoroughly entertained and impressed with the presentation by Mark VA2MM on his remote station set-up. Mark started off by explaining that he had envisioned a fairly straight forward and relative inexpensive system. However, as can often be the case, things got complicated. He explained that his cottage in Temiscaming lacks reliable AC and Internet connection. He therefore had to develop systems that could restart automatically. Otherwise it would mean a 15 hour round trip. Mark originally used an IC-706 with the removable head located at his home QTH providing all the functionality required.

Over time this evolved to an Elecraft K3 in his remote location controlled with a K3/0 in Montreal. The rest of his equipment and software is there to

provide the link and support the irregular infrastructure at the cottage.

He said he uses remote QTH Software for Raspberry Pi for rotor control and antenna selection. His signal goes out on an Elecraft KPA500 linear using a KAT500 automatic tuner. Mark would not, or could not tell us the total cost of the entire operation. He did say that he was pleased to get some really good deals on some used equipment.

He presented a video of one of his recent QSO's. He ended by taking questions from the floor. As you can imagine, there was great interest and lots of questions.

He admitted he is probably not through quite yet. There can always be more things to add. Many thanks, Mark. Very well done. Please return and update us on any future enhancements.

The HVU (HF, VHF or UHF) Scanner frequencies of the month column

US Air Force EAM 11.175 (USB) & CanForce (CFB Trenton) 11.232 (USB)

During the night they use HF frequencies in the lower bands. The frequencies listed above are used in conjunction with the local VHF civilian air band (108-136 MHz - AM) and military air band (225-380 MHz - AM).
